

## **En Pointe Technologies Provides Technology Refresh to Los Angeles Police Department**

Los Angeles, CA – September 5, 2001 – En Pointe Technologies, Inc. The installations were conducted over a 6-month period on Saturdays in order to ensure minimal disruption in the stations.
